Whittlesey Motors to Feature New Toyota Corona Sports Sedan Here

The 1966 Toyota Corona sports sedan, now being introduced at Whittlesey Motors, Inc., at 2955 Pacific Coast Hwy., features the most potent power package in its field and luxury extras and styling normally associated with fine automobiles at twice the price.

Precision engineering which has made Japan's Toyota Motor Co. the world's third largest producer of commercial vehicles, is illustrated in the 90-horsepower engine which accelerates to 100 miles per hour in seconds and runs as smooth as a jeweled watch.

Although the new Toyota Corona's big 1900 cc engine performs like the finest sports car, it has been "overbuilt" to withstand more punishment than most cars ever have to take.

TOYOTA'S front independent coil spring and rear semi-elliptic leaf spring suspension system makes this small car ride and handle like the higher priced sports cars. It has the maneuverability and ease of handling to thread its way through congested city traffic with

all the agility of a needle. One of the most amazing features of the new Toyota Corona, by American standards, is the unusual amount of head, leg and trunk room that affords the U.S. motorist a freedom of movement and visibility not normally found in the small car field.

Another unique feature designed to appeal to American drivers is the Corona's synchromesh in all forward gears.

THE INTERIOR of the new Corona features wide foam rubber seats, upholstered and tailored in nylon and vinyl trim. The interior ensembles are decorator-matched to the exteriors.

Additional features include the new Corona's directional signals incorporated in the horn ring, courtesy lights operated by all four doors, adjustable louvre air vents, and padded arm rests on all four doors.

OTHER "EXTRAS" that are standard equipment on the new Toyota Corona are padded doors and dash; warning light when parking brake is engaged; twin sun visors; 2-speed positive electric, full-

sweep windshield wipers and washer; ash trays in front and rear compartments; alternator; and cigarette lighter.
