

**HOLLYWOOD BOWL**  
Soprano Martina Arroyo and tenor Richard Verreau have been announced as soloists in Berlioz' "Damnation of Faust" scheduled for Aug. 17 in Hollywood Bowl with Alfred Wallenstein conducting the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. Also on the program will be Theodore Uppman and Laurence Bogue, baritone, and the Roger Wagner Choral. Soloists have also been announced for the other major choral work at Hollywood Bowl this summer—Giuseppe Verdi's "Mozart" Requiem on Aug. 28. Zubin Mehta will conduct the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra, assisted by Teresa Stratas, soprano; Lill Chookasian, contralto; Verreau, tenor; Ezio Flagello, bass; and Roger Wagner Choral.

The Berlioz work first appeared in the Philharmonic repertoire in 1955 under the baton of Wallenstein. It was premiered at the Paris Opera in 1846. First Bowl production was in 1958. Verdi conducted the Requiem May 22, 1874 as a tribute to his friend, Alessandro Monzoni, one of the chief figures of Italian literature who died in 1873 after an illustrious career. His novel "I Promessi Sposi," (The Betrothed) one of the world's greatest romances, went into 118 editions.

First Bowl presentation of "The Requiem" was in 1932. Mehta has conducted it during a winter Philharmonic series. Conductor Andre Previn and Pianist Leonard Pennario will open Hollywood Bowl's Symphonies Under the Stars season Tues., July 6.
