Better Foods Market To Show Robot Circus

"It's the greatest show on earth . . . or at least in the area," said Chuck Henke, manager of the Better Food Market at 5305 Torrance Blvd., "There's fun and entertainment for young and old, as well as educational value in this exciting exhibit." That's how Henke described an animated robot circus which will "play" at the local supermarket for two weeks, beginning Tuesday. The circus, imported from Europe, is made up of more than 60 different animated robots which perform their acts just as any live circus star might do. There's a lion that roars, a tiger that growls, a monkey band that plays real music and even a cow that seems to be giving real milk. Especially built in West Germany, all of the animals and toys in the robot show, together with the electronic equipment which operates them, have been imported to the United States for the current tour of exhibits. "Free guided tours may be arranged for school groups, women's clubs, or children's groups of all kinds," Henke said. Presented by the local market firm as a public service, there is no charge or obligation of any kind, and it will be on display daily for two weeks at the Torrance Boulevard store.

Redondo Sea Barrier Adds Project Unit

Completion of an additional unit of the west coast sea barrier project in Redondo Beach at a cost of \$420,300 was disclosed by Burton W. Chance, chairman of the County Board of Supervisors. Acceptance of the project—labeled Unit 1D—was recommended by Walter J. Wood, Flood Control District chief. The unit involved drilling 19 recharge wells which are part of the over-all system to hold back further contamination of fresh water supplies by ocean water infiltration. The wells are within the dedicated street right-of-way of Prospect Avenue between Anita and Spencer streets. The wells, 32 inches in diameter, are from 600 to 700 feet deep. Present plans indicate the entire barrier project along the coastline will be in operation by early 1967 at a total cost of \$6.5 million.
