Tagged Bass Caught by Bromfield

Actor John Bromfield, television's famed "Sheriff of Cochise," earned a \$1 reward from the Department of Fish and Game this week by turning in a tagged sand bass he caught Sunday off the Orange County coast.

Bromfield also received the customary commendation card sealed in plastic and a letter of acknowledgment and thanks from the Department. The letter described the tagging program, which is designed to reveal the growth and movement of fish.

Oddly enough, the sand bass was the last one of 261 tagged by DFG biologists aboard the research vessel Nautilus last month. It was also the only one tagged near Laguna Beach, the same area where Bromfield caught it.

The fish had been tagged and released June 12 weighing 1 1/4 pounds and measuring 13 3/4 inches in length. When Bromfield caught it five weeks later the fish still weighed 1 1/4 pounds but had grown a quarter of an inch.

In District 26 at Southwood Field Lunada Bay went extra innings to beat Riviera, 3-1.


All scoring came in the eighth inning. Pitcher Greg Richards walked and Mike Nelson's second hit of the game went through right field for a two-base error.
