

# Menveg Pledges to Work For Fair Gas Tax Split

Action to release \$99 million plus in federal highway funds, which were withdrawn from Southern California's allocation last week because of San Francisco's rejection of two freeway segments, has been urged by Lloyd A. Menveg of Wilmington in telegrams to U.S. Senators George Murphy and Thomas H. Kuchel and Congressman Cecil R. King.

Noting that 60 per cent of the state's population live and drive in Southern California, Menveg stated that the estimated 3-year setback to eight Southland freeway systems "could well be disastrous."

# Root Has Praise for Urban Renewal Plans

Urban Renewal has been very effective in eliminating blight and slum areas in the United States, according to Harry Root, a candidate for the Democratic nomination for State Senator from the 32nd District.

Speaking before the Lomita Property Owners Association, Root said, "Urban Renewal programs are initiated in a community by a City Council, civic or church group, or any other organization that seeks to conserve, rehabilitate or redevelop a blighted area."

"The City Council of a community will normally adopt a master plan for guided development of the program, enact laws setting standards for good commercial and housing development, set up an administrative organization to carry out the program, make surveys of blighted areas, plan the financing of the Urban Renewal program, and assist in rehousing of displaced families and encourage local citizens to participate in the plan."

ROOT EMPHASIZED that before a plan of redevelopment is adopted by a city, the council holds public hearings to be certain that the residents within the city approve of the overall development. He also said that every

used in the allocation of federal highway funds. The Mayo-Breed formula, established in the mid-30's, "allegedly apportions 45 per cent of these funds to Northern California and 55 per cent to Southern California. But for purposes of this distribution four northern counties were added to the eight Southern California counties," Menveg explained.

"WE THEREFORE receive less than 55 per cent although more than 67 per cent of these funds are collected from the eight Southland counties. More than half of these taxes are paid by gasoline users in Los Angeles County, which is also the heaviest loser in the federal fund withdrawal," he noted.

"I am confident that it is not the intention of the federal government to further penalize Southern California because of northern action," Menveg stated in his telegram to the legislators in Washington. "Fortunately, reapportionment will give us equitable

representation for the first time in 30 years in the next session of the State Senate, where all former efforts to correct these inequities have been blocked by the previous, northern majority. As a state senate candidate from Los Angeles County, I have pledged to lead a fight for fair distribution of state tax funds," he said.
