NOTICE OF SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND ELECTION
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the qualified electors of the TORRANCE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT of Los Angeles County, California, that in accordance with the provisions of the Education Code of the State of California, an election will be held on the 7th day of June, 1966, in said district, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. (during which period and between which hours the polls shall remain open) for the election of the following proposition shall be included on the ballot:
Shall the Torrance Unified School District of Los Angeles County, California, incur a bonded indebtedness of NINE MILLION DOLLARS (\$9,000,000.00) for the purpose of raising money for the following purposes:
(a) The purchasing of school lots.
(b) The building or improving of school buildings.
(c) The making of alterations or additions to the school building or buildings other than such as may be necessary for current maintenance, operation, or repairs.
(d) The repairing, restoring, or rebuilding of any school building damaged, injured, or destroyed by fire or other public calamity.
(e) The supplying of school buildings and grounds with furniture, equipment or necessary apparatus of a permanent nature.
(f) The permanent improvement of the school grounds.
(g) The funding of school building aid loans.
(h) The carrying out of the projects or purposes authorized in Section 15811 of the Education Code.
All of the enumerated purposes as set forth in the ballot proposition above shall be united and voted upon as one single proposition.
Upon request by the district and upon approval of consent and order by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, the Superintendent of Schools of said county has effected the consolidation of such bond election with the DIRECT PRIMARY Election to be held on JUNE 7, 1966.
The said bonds proposed to be issued and sold shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed five per cent per annum; that the interest for the first year shall be payable in one installment at the end of said year and all interest thereafter shall be payable semiannually; that the number of years the whole or any part of the bonds are to run shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years from the date of the bonds or the date of any series thereof.
For the purpose of holding the said bond election the precincts polling places and officers of election for the said bond election shall be the same as the precincts polling places and election officers provided for the said DIRECT PRIMARY Election within said district. The canvass for the election returns will be commenced at 1 p.m. on Thursday, JUNE 9, 1966, by the County Registrar of Voters at his office at 508 North Spring Street, Los Angeles, California.
The deadline for the receipt of absentee ballots by the Registrar of Voters is 5 p.m. on Monday, JUNE 6, 1966. Applications for absentee voter ballots may be made to said Registrar of Voters on and after MAY 9, 1966, (28th day prior to election) and prior to 5 p.m. on MAY 31, 1966 (7th day prior to election).
The County Superintendent of Schools, by this Notice of Election, has called this election pursuant to an Order of the Governing Board of the district, adopted MARCH 21, 1965, in accordance with the provisions of Education Code Sections 1303, 1323, 1342 and 31701.
