Board Member Cites Four Areas of Need for Bonds

Bottommost item on the ballot for Torrance voters at the June 7 primary election is a \$9 million school bond issue which is labeled Proposition FF.

Uppermost in the minds of Torrance voters, however, is the question, "Where will the bond money go?"

William Hanson, president of the Torrance Board of Education, points out four areas where bond funds will be used:

- To build additional elementary classrooms.
- To equalize facilities at the district's four high schools.
- To provide facilities for the departmentalized programs at the city's elementary schools.
- To purchase land and build two more schools.

ALMOST HALF the total funds will be used at the city's four high schools, Hanson said.

Additions planned for the industrial arts facility, rehabilitation and additions to the multipurpose building, and bleacher seating and restroom facilities at North High.

Building elementary classrooms and schools to house the population which is growing at the rate of 1,200 to 1,500 students a year will account for more than a third of the bond issue, Hanson said.
