

Construction Begins for College

Construction of new facilities for California State College at Palos Verdes has begun at a 347-acre site in the Dominguez Hills east of Torrance.

The college will be relocated on the permanent site in September, at which time it will be officially designated California State College, Dominguez Hills. Until permanent buildings are completed, the college will occupy leased quarters near the Dominguez campus.

Juniors entering the fall will be able to select majors in English, music, chemistry,

mathematics, history, and psychology. Freshmen, in addition to majors previously listed, may choose from such fields as art, French, philosophy, Spanish, biological science, physics, economics, geography, political science, and sociology.

In addition, the college academic plan provides for interdepartmental majors in such fields as East Asian Studies, Linguistics, theater arts, earth and space science, American business and economic systems, behavioral sciences, and environmental design and urban studies.

The new facilities will provide laboratories and special classrooms for the needs of a four-year college, as well as 14 lecture rooms varying in size from 15 to 85 student stations. Special facilities, such as a fully equipped audio visual center, administrative and faculty offices, a campus dining room, and off-street parking facilities will be included.

Housewives Swim Class

Swimming classes for housewives have been started by the Torrance Recreation Department at the city plunge. Classes are being held on Wednesdays and Thursdays through May 31. A second four-week series is being held on Wednesdays and Thursdays through June 2.

Classes meet at 9:30 a.m. for intermediate swimmers and beginners sessions are held at 10:30 a.m. Classes for

advanced beginners and beginners meet at 11:30 a.m.

Synchronized swimming classes are included in the Wednesday and Thursday beginning at 11:30 a.m.

A tiny tots class will be held during each meeting. Children whose mothers are participating in the swimming classes are eligible, provided they are at least 3 years of age. Activities include games, a rhythm band, and crafts.

A fee of \$2.50 is required for the swimming classes. A 50-cent fee for materials is required for the tiny tots program.

State Aide To Support Dills' Bid

George R. Reilly, chairman of the State Board of Equalization, this week endorsed Judge Ralph C. Dills for the Democratic nomination for the State Senate in the 32nd District.

Noting that Judge Dills is the only candidate with both legislative and judicial experience, Reilly said he wanted to "issue a strong recommendation to the voters in your area to nominate you for this important post."

Dills served six terms as an Assemblyman during Reilly's service on the Board of Equalization. During those terms, he served on the com-

mittee on revenue and taxation and on financial institutions.

He also was chairman of the committee on manufacturing, oil and mining industries, and the interim committee on petroleum and tidal lands problems.
