...Let's Go

Almost a year later—having left India with mixed feelings about the country and the people, I still remember vividly my first encounter with a Cobra. In Spain, it's the bull-fights that draw the blood-thirsty. In Mexico, it's the cock-fights—but in India it's their age-old battle of the cobra and the mongoose.

Friends had advised me to try and catch a battle between the two, if at all possible. It seems to be a must for all travelers to India to be exposed to this "show". It was an exciting event to look forward to—at least I thought so at the time. What it really turns out to be is hilarious in many ways and instances.

Everybody is afraid of the cobra—even other cobras. They eat each other and anything else they can get their fangs into. They are plentiful in India, but yet the prices for them are high because of the demand. In 1955 the first cobra bred in captivity produced forty-one eggs at the Bronx Park Zoo. Seventeen of the eggs hatched but in four or five months they had all died. The zoo keepers are still trying to figure out what went wrong.

IN CALCUTTA I finally saw a cobra. We were walking along a beautiful park area when we were approached by a young Indian carrying a straw basket, a small cloth sack and a very strange looking instrument that resembled a home-made flute. Of course anyone would know what was in the basket and what was in the bag—but I had to ask.

It wouldn't have surprised me any more to see him pull out a rope from the basket and climb up into nowhere carrying the sack—than to actually see this sinister-looking snake come spitting out of the basket. I only jumped

8 feet into the air! This frightening incident did not occur until an ample amount of money changed hands—that you can be sure.

The young Indian put on a "cobra show" for us, playing his flute, which apparently made the cobra go through some rather menacing gyrations. We ohed and ahed—then a few gasps of relief to see the snake crawl back into his basket. It was extremely short but very impressive.

ALL THIS TIME the mongoose had been very quiet in his sack. After the cobra retreated into the basket, the mongoose seemed to come to life—in any case, the sack began to jump around. At this point, the Indian offered to put on a match between the two for us. It would be a good show—and it would be a battle to the finish—one of them must die. The asking price was too much for us and by this time I had begun to feel sorry for the cobra, as I learned that the mongoose always wins.

One of our Indian friends later told me that we were wise not to pay to see the "battle." It seems that a favorite trick of some unscrupulous cobra owners is to stage a show for a large group—collecting from each person individually—guaranteeing a dead animal.

After a short fight, two or three accomplices crowd around and one of them quickly exchanges a dead cobra for the live one—holding up the dead one for the crowd to see. This clever maneuver lets them use the same cobra over and over—pretty smart.

PUC Helps Pay Signal Costs

The California Public Utilities Commission reported today that it has allocated 4,818 to Torrance to assist the city in paying its share of the cost of providing improved protective devices at the Sepulveda Boulevard and Carson Street crossings over spur tracks of the Santa Fe Railway.

Three flashing light signals have been installed at both crossings, replacing warning signs. Total cost of the devices was \$19,272, shared equally by the railroad and the city.
