Commissioner Urges Safe Memorial Day

California's Highway Patrol Commissioner, Bradford M. Crittenden, said today that Highway Patrol officers throughout the state would do their utmost to assist Memorial Day weekend drivers through a safe holiday period.

"But these officers can't do it all alone," emphasized the Commissioner. "It will still be up to the driver himself to assure a safe holiday weekend."

"Our officers will be on the lookout for excessive speeds and other infractions of the rules of the road that traditionally lead to accidents, and will stop these whenever they see them," said Crittenden. However, he urged all drivers to take it upon themselves to drive courteously, carefully and lawfully at all times, in order to make a success of this effort toward a safe holiday.

Crittenden declined to predict how many people would be killed and injured on the California highways during the long weekend, but said he could predict injury and possibly death as a potential each time the rules of the road are broken or in cases of error in driving judgment.

"Our officers will do their part to alleviate the situation," concluded Crittenden. "Now, if California drivers do their part, we will have a safer Memorial Day weekend."

Air Force Changes Rules On Re-Enlistment Grades

Recognizing that stripes on the sleeves are still of utmost importance to the man in uniform, the Air Force this week announced major changes in its prior service criteria. Changes officials hope will make it easier for exservicemen in numerous needed skills to resume their careers in Air Force Blue.

Effective immediately and until at least June 30, former servicemen may now enlist in the same grade held at separation from active duty providing they are enlisted prior to the second anniversary of their separation date. Formally, an ex-serviceman separated more than one year would automatically be enlisted at a lesser pay grade. Proportionally, prior servicemen separated longer than

two years will qualify for higher pay grades than in the past. Veterans may now be enlisted prior to the fourth anniversary of their separation. Previously, those separated for more than three years were ineligible.

All of the above changes apply to all former servicemen of any of the Armed Forces provided their career field is listed on the Air Force's needed skill list and the grade limitation for that skill is not exceeded.


day. Nonresidents may register for all programs within the week prior to the first class session, if openings are still available at that time.
