

Garden Checklist

- Mulch around moisture loving plants such as camellias, rhododendrons, fuchsias, hibiscus, with steer manure, peat moss or bark. This preserves moisture in the soil.
- Plant zinnias, dwarf dahlias, salvia and other late summer annuals in sunny garden spots.
- Lawns fed lightly once a month do better than lawns which are given heavier doses less frequently. Use weed control on lawns this month, also.
- Bearded iris may be divided now if the clumps are crowded. New iris may be ordered now for planting any time until fall.
- Spring-blooming daffodils and narcissus may be lifted when tops have died down, not before. This could be anytime between now and the end of July, depending on where you live and how much water they have received.

Law in Action

Mike Madd picked up his pistol, aimed it at his wife and fired. But Mike is a poor shot. The bullet accidentally killed a neighbor next door. Mike is charged with attempted murder on his wife, and with his neighbor's murder.

Though Mike did not mean to kill his neighbor, the law says that it is still murder. The law transfers his intent to kill his wife to intent to kill his neighbor. Mike can be convicted of both charges. This same rule applies to other highly dangerous acts. Suppose a person shoots into a crowd or at a moving train or car, or commits any "man-endangering act" with malice. He can be convicted of murder. Such an act alone is enough to become murder.

FROM THIS "felony-murder" rule has grown up in the law. The person who commits a felony in the course of which he accidentally kills someone can be charged with murder. The person who commits a highly dangerous felony, such as robbery, arson, or mayhem runs the risk of a first degree murder charge. If such a crime results in a death, the court can find the felon guilty of first degree murder, the

IN A RECENT case, however, the California Supreme Court said that the felony-murder charge applies only if the killing actually came from the felon's gun or "hands." If a robbery victim, say, fires back and accidentally kills someone, the robber can be charged only with robbery, not with murder. Thus if the policeman shoots a bystander in chasing the robber the fleeing robber cannot be charged with murder. He can only be tried for robbery.
