 itself to give the most grueling of "road tests" to auto brakes—without ever leaving a unique new electronic laboratory.
 The Bendix Corporation, now building the brake test facility at its South Bend, Ind. plant, reveals that the new equipment will make use of four interconnected "dynamometers"—machines used to test the stopping ability of brakes under varying vehicle speeds and loads. Essentially, the dynamometer is a heavy flywheel; its high-speed, high-load spinning simulates the punishment im-

posed upon brakes provided by a speeding car.
 Linked to the dynamometer will be a 32-foot instrument panel. In the panel will be an electronic tape unit into which may be "programmed" any conceivable combination of stops and starts, and speeds and loads, to duplicate the roughest possible brake punishment.
 A NEW transistorized record player imported from England can be played in almost any position and the manufacturer claims that even "violent movement" will not jump the stylus out of the groove. The "Discatron" is similar in appearance to a transistor radio with carry-

ing handle. Records are simply dropped into a slot, and at the press of a button, the motor starts and presents the stylus to the record face. Designed for 7-inch, 45 rpm records... Even amateurs can enlarge negatives with the Automator "M." Press a button and the whole process of development takes place automatically, resulting in enlargements of from 3 x 4 inches up to 7 x 10 inches... Sailors will like the Leech nautical hand baring compass which has light illumination for night prismatic readings. The cardinal points are positioned in such a way that they can be read off through the prism. Bowl

diameter is three inches and instrument is tested to an accuracy of plus-or-minus one-half degree.

Action Law in

Everyone acts for his own best interest and with ordinary care. This legal presumption can be important when little evidence is available to prove some fact.

For example, suppose an intersection crash takes place late at night. Jones is killed, and the evidence seems to show that Smith, the surviving driver, is at fault. When Jones' widow sued Smith he claimed that Jones was at fault. Presuming that Jones

acted with care and in his own interest, the court is likely to hold that Jones was not at fault unless Smith can prove otherwise.

THE SAME presumption can work for a deceased defendant. Had Jones lived and Smith died, Smith's survivors could invoke the presumption of due care and Jones would have to show otherwise.

The presumption also benefits the victim of amnesia, who, because of the accident, cannot testify in a dispute as to what happened. He is deemed to have acted with due care. Other facts, if any, must be shown at the trial to overcome the presumption.

 If the party to the lawsuit can testify, he must explain what happened. His silence will not give him the benefit of the presumption. Or, if other witnesses can explain fully what happened, the presumption will not apply.

In a recent case Jimmie, a six year old child, was struck by Black's car. There was little evidence to show how the accident happened. Jimmie's head injury caused lapses in his memory. When Black was sued, he unsuccessfully tried to claim that a six year old youngster ordinarily does not act with due care and is not entitled to the presumption. WIEN A YOUNGSTER can

testify in a case, the judge must decide whether the child is a competent witness. As to those under ten, the judge will ask questions to test the child's recollection. The child must understand that he must tell the truth and may be punished if he does not.
