Planning to Begin for
Vocational Center Here

Planning for vocational education for area high school students will get under way July 1 when Wilbur W. Lorbeer assumes the post of planning director for the Torrance Unified School District.

Lorbeer, who will plan the program for a regional occupational skills center to be constructed on land acquired from the Navy, has been in the field of industrial education for 14 years.

Originally employed in 1952 by Los Angeles City Schools as an industrial education teacher at Banning High School, he has held the posts of department chairman, consultant, and specialist for the Los Angeles schools.

He organized the industrial occupation program on a city-wide level and supervised its development from classes in 1962 to some 15 classes during the past year.

A graduate of the University of California at Santa Barbara, he holds a master's degree from Long Beach State College and has done post-graduate work at the University of Southern California.

Married and father of three children, Lorbeer lives in Long Beach. He has served on the board of directors of the

Long Beach Civic League, has been president of the Alamitos Bay Community Interested Association, raised funds for the Wilmington YMCA, served on the Harbor Junior College Technical Advisory Committee, and served on the National Advisory Board of the Brooks Foundation of Santa Barbara.

Registration for summer classes ranging from air conditioning through zoology will take place in the Communications Center for currently enrolled students on Monday from 1 to 3 and 5:30 to 7 p.m. On Tuesday during identical hours in the same building, new and former students will register.

Registrants must be 18 years of age or older, or a

high school graduate. The district requirement is waived for the first summer session.
