

Montgomery Grads Win Braille Institute Sets 10-Week Summer Term Grants Worth \$140,000

Forty-one scholarships valued at \$140,000 have been won by graduates at Bishop Montgomery High School. The total is a new record for Montgomery graduates. Fourteen students were named finalists in the California State Scholarship competition and earned first-year grants totaling \$14,582. If all 14 maintain "B" averages during their four years in college, the grants will be worth \$58,328. A total of 34 Montgomery seniors were semi-finalists in the State Scholarship competition. Scholarships to the University of San Francisco and St. Mary's College in Moraga, Calif., were awarded to eight graduates. The value is pegged at more than \$10,500. Other scholarships were awarded for such institutions as the U. S. Naval Academy, the U. S. Military Academy, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, California Institute of Technology, the University of Louisville, Ky., Catholic University of America, Mount St. Mary's College

One of the nation's largest summer programs for the blind is under way at the Braille Institute, 741 N. Vermont Ave., Los Angeles. Classes for the summer term began Monday, according to John M. Holmes, executive director. More than 60 academic and practical courses for blind persons are being offered during the 10-week session, Holmes said. Classes include such courses as Braille reading and writing, mobility (White cane), touch typing, spelling, English, Spanish, ham radio, home management, and hand writing. The Institute's Arts and Crafts Department is offering such classes as teaching the blind how to bowl, current events, millinery, music appreciation, gardening, and oil painting. A special "Sunshine Club" has been organized for senior citizens. A teenage program offers academic and practical classes Mondays through Thursdays and special field trips each Friday. The Institute also operates three day camps for blind youngsters between 8 and 14 years of age. Camps are in Pasadena, the San Fernando Valley, and Garden Grove. A resident camp will be operation during August in the San Bernardino Mountains. All classes, activities, and services offered at the Braille Institute are free of charge to the blind of all ages. Holmes also said volunteer drivers are especially needed during the summer months. Persons wishing to volunteer for driving duties may call NO. 3-1111, Extension 20.
