## Airline Honors Garrett As 'Company of Month'

The Garrett Corp. has been selected by American Airlines for special recognition during the month of July as American's "Company of the Month."

H. H. Wetzel, Garrett president, accepted an award presented by the airline in "recognition of Garrett's continuing contributions to the development of air transportation as an important influence on the economic and cultural advancement throughout the world."

The award was presented by American Airlines officials A. R. Bone Jr., regional vice president of sales and services, and Ed Beal, Los Angeles sales manager.

AS COMPANY of the month, all Garrett employees flying American Airlines in July will be given special recognition by American personnel.

For nearly 30 years Garrett has maintained a close relationship with the airline industry, developing and producing sophisticated aircraft systems enabling airliners to fly higher, faster, and safer and ensuring living room comfort for passengers.

MUCH OF Garrett's success stems from its efforts to sustain life in rarified atmosphere. The late J. C. Garrett, founder of the company, believed the future of aviation hinged on man's ability to fly higher and faster. To do this, an aircraft would have to carry its own environment. ## Hahn Praises New Move Toward Transit System

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn today praised the action of the State Legislature in allocating \$3.9 million in tidelands oil money for rapid transit planning in Los Angeles County.

"I commend the Legislature for this action in the best interests of the taxpayers to solve one of Los Angeles' most pressing problems."

"The motorist is already heavily overtaxed by licenses, registration, and gasoline tax," Hahn said. "The tidelands oil money can benefit all citizens, both motorists and public transportation commuters, without directly taxing them."

Hahn strongly urged the Legislature to take the action in a motion approved by the Board of Supervisors last May 31. That motion reaffirmed a long-standing request to allow the use of tidelands oil money for rapid transit.

He first suggested using tidelands oil revenue for rapid transit planning in April, 1963.

Hahn noted that the Southern California Rapid Transit District Board of Directors last week asked for matching Federal funds for transit planning. Highest priority would be given to a line from downtown Los Angeles to International Airport if the plans are approved.

Hahn has long been a leading advocate of the airport corridor to serve the citizens of Southwest Los Angeles and the commuters between the airport and the Los Angeles civic center.

"With the action of the State Legislature, there is no reason why the transit directors cannot move forward with dispatch in providing the best rapid transit system in the world for Los Angeles," Hahn said.

## Trips Set For Youths
