

Brother of Slain Doctor Plans Trip to the Congo

Dr. Dwight Carlson, brother of the late Dr. Paul Carlson and a resident at Harbor General Hospital, will leave this area Saturday to travel to the Congo.

Dr. Carlson will be searching for a site to establish a medical center in memory of his late brother, the Press-Herald was told yesterday.

Dr. Paul Carlson was slain by Congolese rebels in November, 1964. He had re-

mained in the northern Congo after sending his wife and family out of the area and was subsequently captured by rebels.

He was slain moments before Belgian paratroopers landed in Stanleyville, The Congo, and freed the city.

The medical center to be established in The Congo is a project of the Dr. Paul Carlson Foundation, the Press-Herald was told.

The city delegation, to be headed by Mayor Albert Isen and City Manager Edward J. Ferraro, will meet with officials of the Housing and Home Finance Agency (HHFA) to discuss federal and local obligations under the urban renewal program. The city last Wednesday submitted its Part I application, which includes a request for funds to finance the project, which involves property at the west end of the Torrance Municipal Airport.

the proposal "to find out how the people feel." He contends purchase is possible without significant outlays by the city. Financing through revenue bonds is possible, Isen said, without increasing water bills now paid by customers of the two companies.

The mayor said he was not proposing an immediate expenditure—an estimated \$150,000 would be required to determine if purchase is feasible—but wanted to find out what support the proposal would have before committing funds for a survey.
