

Plans Ordered For New Floor

County Supervisors have now near completion at 825 Maple Ave. The opening of the first four floors and basement is scheduled for March, Chace said.

The action came yesterday when supervisors hired the architectural firm of Adams, Latham, Kripp and Wright at a fee of \$14,925.

The firm designed the first four floors of the structure.

THE NEED to complete the fifth floor was determined after construction on the first floor was started, Chace said.

"The fifth floor was to remain unfinished to accommodate future expansion," Chace said. "However, immediate additional space requirements prompted us to move ahead in developing that floor."

Three New Proposals On Ballot

Consolidation of three South Bay elections with the Nov. 8 general election has been approved by county supervisors, Board Chairman Burton W. Chace said today.

At the request of the districts involved, Supervisors included ballot proposals of Torrance Unified School District, El Camino College District and the South Bay Hospital District on the general ballot.

"The county is anxious to work with school and hospital district to save the costs of special elections," Chace said.
