'Voter's Handbook' Now Ready for Distribution

As the author of the one of the proposed amendments to the State Constitution to be on the ballot at the General Election, Tuesday, Nov. 8, I have received one copy of what is popularly called the "Voter's Handbook." Each registered voter in California will receive through the mail one copy of the same publication long before the November election.

The "handbook" was prepared by my good friend, the Honorable George H. Murphy, Legislative Counsel, whose law offices are directly under my office in the State Capitol, and it is distributed by another friend of mine, the Honorable Frank M. Jordan, Secretary of State.

California State Constitution. You can obtain a well-indexed copy free if you will write to the Honorable James C. Driscoll, Chief Clerk of the Assembly, Suite 5165, Assembly Chambers, State Capitol, Sacramento 14, Calif.

Actually, the book contains also the U. S. Constitution (indexed), the Declaration of Independence, the Magna Carta (Great Charter), the Mayflower Compact, and other landmark documents. The book is well printed and bound in heavy paper.

James C. Driscoll is not only Chief Clerk of the As-

sembly but when the Legislature is in session he also serves as our Chief Parliamentarian. He is an extremely busy man throughout the year and has only a very small staff to help him. Therefore, if you do not receive the book by return mail, do not despair! It will arrive long before the November 8 election.

The supply is very limited. A new edition will not be printed until sometime in 1967. Several thousand people in the 46th Assembly District already have received their books as a result of following through on this same suggestion which I have made in previous editions of this newspaper.

Crocker-Citizens Sets Opening Of New Branch

Crocker-Citizens National Bank will open new permanent quarters for its Hawthorne-Carson branch next Monday, S. Edgar Lauther, executive vice president, has announced.

Del Amo Developers Name Four New Vice-Presidents

Great Lakes Carbon Corp. has announced the appointment of Michael E. Puyans as executive vice president. The firm also named three group vice presidents, Joseph G. Solari, Lawrence J. Sinnott, and Dr. John P. Sachs.

TV Program To Feature THS Group

A Torrance High School science teacher and eight students will appear on an educational television program next October.

Filming of a program entitled "DNA—The Language of Life" took place at Channel 2's KNXT studios during the summer vacation.

The program, which will be featured as part of the "Steps to Learning" series (currently in its 14th year) depicts the story of how chromosomes determine an individual's characteristics.

Featured in the film, which will be telecast on a Sunday in late October, are: Charles Pilet, instructor, and students Randy Jolls, Scott Triplett, Janet Lindbird, Peggy Pettinato, James Cooper, Robin Bingham, James Oliver, Helen Smoot, and Karen Rivera.

The "handbook" or pamphlet consists of sixty pages of fine print, printed on very cheap paper to save money for the taxpayers of California. A total of 9 million have been printed at the State Printing Plant in Sacramento.

My amendment is referred to as Proposition No. 8. Previously it was known as Assembly Constitutional Amendment No. 1 of the Second Extraordinary Session of 1964. The legal analysis, written by George H. Murphy, is found on page 13 of the handbook. The "Argument in Favor of Proposition No. 8" begins on page 13 and ends on page 14.

At my request, State Senator Stephen P. Teale, Democrat, of West Point, read my argument in favor of a "YES" vote on my own amendment, and signed his name as my sponsoring co-author. Incidentally, Senator Teale in private life is a Doctor of Medicine.

The reasons that I asked Senator Teale to counter-sign my argument are: (1) Since I am regarded as a Southern California Republican Assemblyman and Doctor Teale is regarded as a Northern California Democratic Senator, the co-authorship of the argument demonstrates to the voters that it is entirely nonpartisan in nature; (2) Senator Teale helped with the passage of my amendment in the Senate; and (3) "Doc" Teale and I serve together as members of the State Advisory Commission on Indian Affairs, of which he is Chairman.

I wrote the argument myself. The opening sentence is: "This tax reform measure will increase state revenue by an estimated million dollars annually without imposing new taxes or increasing existing tax rates." In the "Voter's Handbook," that sentence was underlined at my request.

In the current issue of the Press-Herald space does not permit me to explain fully my amendment. I have presented the above facts to you merely to demonstrate the fact that behind each proposed amendment to our State Constitution there has been a vast amount of hard work by many people. I do hope that when you receive your copy through the mail you will take the time to read it so that you, yourself, will be prepared to vote when you enter your polling place on Nov. 8.

Part II of the "Voter's Handbook" reproduces the existing portions of the State Constitution which may be amended. Those words and phrases which are to be deleted or amended are printed in what is known as "strikeout" type and the proposed new provisions to be inserted or added are printed in black-faced type, sometimes called bold-face type.

It is much easier to understand the constitutional amendments if you have in front of you the complete
