

Chase Lauds Local Judge Plans Scroll Presentation

Judge William MacFaden has been commended by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace for his "untiring efforts" as a Superior Court jurist.

Judge MacFaden, presiding judge of the Juvenile Court Division, will receive a scroll of commendation from the Board of Supervisors in recognition of his work.

A resident of Torrance and former South Bay Municipal Court Judge, MacFaden recently accepted added responsibilities in the Superior Court.

The Juvenile Division and Domestic Relations Division will be combined into a Family Courts and headed by MacFaden.

"Judge MacFaden has won the respect of his colleagues and has earned the sincere appreciation of the Board of Supervisors for his outstanding work," Chace said.

"There is no judge who puts in more time, thought and effort into his work."

Presentation of the scroll will be made by Supervisor Chace locally.

Allocation of \$3,000 for a highway improvement project on a section of Normandie Avenue was revealed this week by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

County Flood Control Bond Bids Opened

Successful bidders for \$15 million in County Flood Control District storm drain bonds has been announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Winning offer for purchase of the bonds authorized in 1958 was submitted by Chase-Manhattan Bank. The interest rate was 3.88 per cent with a total of four bids unsealed during the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors.

Chace said that funds derived from the sale when added to present cash and investment balances remaining from earlier offerings will finance construction of projects through the spring of 1967.

The new sales brings the total of bonds purchased to finance the program approved by County voters in 1958 to \$210 million.

Total authorization was for \$225 million and the last block of \$15 million is expected to be sold next spring, Chace said.

Stop Signs Authorized

Boulevard stop regulations have been adopted for both sides of Caney Avenue at its intersection with Elsmere Drive, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The new regulations were authorized by the Board of Supervisors Dec. 13. The County Road Department will post the necessary signs within 10 days.
