**BLOOD DONOR**

**Foreman Gets 7-Gallon Pin**

Are you like lots of other healthy people who think one pint of blood will weaken them tremendously? Follow the example of David Jurk, a foreman of the Kila Department at American-Standard in Torrance.

In the past 24 years, David Jurk (pronounced Yurk) of West Carson Street in Torrance, has given seven gallons and four pints of his own blood through the Red Cross Regional Blood Center to help patients in 220 hospitals in Los Angeles and Orange Counties that receive their blood requirements from Red Cross.

Jurk recently was recognized for his noble and outstanding service to his community when Mrs. H. E. Searles, Southern District Red Cross chairman of volunteers, presented him with a Red Cross 7-Gallon Blood Donor pin for his gigantic blood donations over the years.

PRESS-HERALD readers can join the bandwagon and follow Jurk's example by giving blood quarterly or yearly either at work or at a community bloodmobile or both. The next community bloodmobile comes to the Elks

Lodge, 1820 Abalone Ave., Torrance, on Aug. 10, Thursday. The bloodmobile, which will collect blood from 2 to 6:30 p.m., has a quota of 220 pints.

A pint of blood in bulk replenishes itself in the body within 48 to 72 hours. The average human body contains about 12 pints of blood. The components of a pint of blood take about another month to fully replace themselves. To insure health for the donor and perfect blood for the recipient, blood can be given through the Red Cross only once every three months.

ONCE YOUR body has replaced that 12th pint of blood, you have 13 pints in existence—12 for you and one for some lucky person who is alive now thanks to your generous donation, which you shouldn't even miss, Mrs. Searles said.

Blood donors should be 18 to 59 years of age and weigh at least 110 pounds. Donors 18 to 21 years old and unmarried need the written permission of parents or guardians. To make an appointment to be a blood donor on Aug. 10, call the Red Cross Southern District Center in San Pedro.

**Home Air Conditioners Offered on Lease Plan**

Modern gas air conditioning equipment can now be leased for residential use under a new 10-year leasing plan, C. T. Dierker, manager of operations for Uni-Plant Leasing Co., Inc., has announced.

Uni-Plant Leasing is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Pacific Lighting Corp. The leasing plan is being made available for residential use following wide public acceptance of a similar program for commercial facilities, Dierker said.

IT IS AVAILABLE to owners of either single or multiple residential units. While the program is not aimed at tracts, Dierker said, applica-

tions by tract developers may be considered.

Main advantages of the plan, according to Dierker, are that it eliminates the need for an initial cash outlay for the gas air conditioning chiller and provides a convenient method of 10-year financing for this equipment.

Other benefits to the lessee include an additional nine-year warranty; payment of property tax by Uni-Plant as owner of the equipment; and possible tax write-off for owners of income property.

**Vote Funds For Roads In Carson**

County supervisors have allocated \$3,282,892 to Los Angeles for the maintenance of key streets, including many in the Harbor area.

The announcement was made today by Supervisor Burton W. Chace following approval by the Board of Supervisors Tuesday. The allocation is for fiscal 1967-68.

It is a portion of \$10.1 million budgeted by Los Angeles County to assist its 76 cities with road maintenance.

"Many streets in the San Pedro and Carson areas will be improved under terms of the allocation," Chace said. "It's important that all key roads be kept in good condition across the county if our traffic flow is to remain efficient."
