Teachers' Retirement Plan Vetoed by Reagan

SACRAMENTO — Governor Ronald Reagan wasted no time in vetoing SB539, a measure which would have provided for state teachers retirement credit for teaching services performed in other states.

Even as the bill sailed through both houses of the legislature, for the first time in a number of attempts, there never was much doubt but what Reagan would veto the measure. It was authorized by Senator Randolph Collier (D-Yreka).

Reagan's action in applying the quick veto no doubt was designed to cut off any major campaign by proponents of the bill to have it signed. This wouldn't have changed his decision but would have brought him weeks of criticism.

THE BILL was pushed by ARCOSS, Association for Retirement Credit for Out-of-State Service. It was opposed by such groups as the California Taxpayers' Association

and the California School Boards Association. "I am sorry to have had to veto this bill because I recognize that many of these teachers get no retirement credit for their out of state teaching time and, as a result, are forced to live on retirement income that is less than the income received by teachers who spend their entire careers in California," Reagan said. "During the campaign, I expressed sympathy for their plight and I promised to see what could be done."

"I AM STILL hopeful that we can find a way to eventually remedy this situation," he said. "But SB539 is not the way. Our best experts tell us that this will cost the state in the foreseeable future around \$800 million. That kind of money is not available."

Reagan said those voting for the bill were calling for increased spending without providing the money. He urged them to work out a responsible bill and find a reasonable way to finance it.


