

# Frequent Review of House Insurance Policy Advised

Here's a grim statistic: more than 400,000 homes are expected to catch fire in the United States this year. And, if your home is one of them, chances are good that you'll be in for a financial beating even if your home is insured.

About 90 per cent of all homes are covered by some kind of fire insurance, but most homeowners fail to have sufficient coverage, according to an article in the current issue of Reader's Digest. Here are some tips that the article offers on how to avoid financial misery brought on by fire:

Don't be under-insured. A survey showed that some 9,000 insured homes in a Midwestern state, more than one out of five were under-

insured. Inflation makes frequent review of your coverage necessary. For instance, a \$20,000 house built in 1950 would cost \$30,200 to construct today.

Make sure you have the right kind of coverage. Some of the better offers today are package-type coverage. This not only includes adequate fire insurance, but theft and liability coverage, as well.

Be aware of what to do after a fire. Of course, phone your agent, but then take all means to keep down the damage — wipe water off furniture, shut windows against rain and see that any holes in the roof are temporarily covered.

TO THOSE who don't have

A major advance in manufacturing the range of drills heads modern industry is demanding came recently when Winslow developed a drill point grinder capable of producing drills that are literally as fine as hair on your head. Key to the unit is a calibrated optical system that magnifies the drill up to 22 times so the operator is able to observe his ordinarily near-invisible work.

EIGHT YEARS of expansion of products, markets and distribution channels has provided a 94-year-old American firm with a new title. Bulova Watch Co. says it's now the "world's largest watch company in terms of total sales volume."

The firm's world-wide sales for the last fiscal year period totaled almost \$124 million, an increase of 24 per cent over the previous 12-month period. Sales abroad of Bulova consumer products increased 38 per cent in the same fiscal span.

In achieving the top spot in an industry that does an estimated annual business in excess of one billion dollars, Bulova has developed what it calls the industry's most diversified group of watch product lines and an extensive combination of manufacturing facilities on three continents.

THE FIRM began its world-wide sales building in 1961, servicing 19 markets. Today, 1,500 employees in five overseas subsidiaries are involved in the distribution and sales of Bulova products in 89 countries.

"In a world that shrinks daily in a technological and sociological sense the universal need for personal time-

keeping devices has never been stronger. It's one indication of the vitality of the market for the company that is world-oriented," says Bulova chairman Omar N. Bradley.

A boat signaling kit for daytime and nighttime boating emergencies has been introduced. It consists of two smoke flares that emit orange smoke; one 5-minute flare that burns a brilliant red; water dye to cover 5,000 square feet, and a distress flag. . . . A new oscillating sprinkler features a 4-position spray area control dial that sets the sprinkler for any one of four different watering positions — full area, partial area, left side, right side.
