

Concert Ticket Drive Begins

Opens at Music Center Nov. 9

Peninsula Committee for the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra is launching a season ticket drive for the Los Angeles Philharmonic series in this community before the box office tickets go on sale to the general public.

Miss Aletha Browne and Mrs. Jack Jacobson, co-chairmen of this committee, have announced that many good seats are still available. The season begins in November at the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion at the Music Center.

Conducted by the Indian-born Zubin Mehta, the orchestra recently returned from an eastern tour where it was brilliantly received. Now it has just left for a world tour of 23 cities and 41 concerts. Two of these cities, Bombay and New Delhi, are in Mr. Mehta's homeland.

Each series has ten concerts and these will be held on Thursday and Friday evenings and Friday and Sunday matinees.

For the Friday afternoon series a bus will provide transportation for anyone in the Peninsula area to go to and from the Music Center. It leaves from various stops on the Peninsula in the morning enabling those who wish to attend the Concert Previews or go shopping before the matinee.

The music selected varies from classical to modern scores and promises to be a most interesting season.

A new and welcomed innovation will be presented to the community later this year by the Peninsula Committee for the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. It will be a series of three lectures held in this area designed to bring fuller enjoyment of the succeeding concerts.
