

# Reagan Renews His Pledge On Repeal of Rumford Act

**SACRAMENTO** — Indications that Governor Ronald Reagan has not given up on his campaign statements concerning repeal of the Rumford Act are seen in his address Tuesday to members of the California Real Estate Association, which is holding an annual convention in Los Angeles.

"One of the promises," he said, "was to seek repeal of the Rumford Act, and if that were not practical, modification of the act to the point where it was no longer discriminatory or oppressive."

"That still is our goal."

The legislature gave Reagan a decisive setback. The state senate voted repeal of the act, and when the bill went to the assembly, there were attempts to modify the measure.

petus for ultimate rejection of the act by the people. He said the free enterprise system could hardly exist "since this system recognizes that one of man's basic rights is the right to own and dispose of his property as he sees fit and to use it as he sees fit as long as he does not infringe on the property rights of those around him."

"Let me make it plain," he declared, "that I do not feel disagreement with this act in way should be taken as endorsement of bigotry and prejudice, or the practice of discrimination."

"I OPPOSE the Rumford Act for the same reason I oppose restrictive covenants. Freedom is based on the right of an individual to personal ownership of property, and this basic right cannot be infringed upon by majority rule."

"The very meaning of the Bill of Rights is that certain inalienable rights cannot be submitted to a vote. We erode that principle at great risk to us all, indeed, to freedom itself."

"For 35 years, the advocates of big government have inched forward. They have nibbled away at freedom, at state government, at local government."

"WHAT THEY have taken over a 35 year period, we cannot get back this year or next, but we can make a beginning."

"This is what we are trying to do. That is what we will try to do again next year. We may not get the Rumford Act repealed, but if we can keep all our people together, we can make a beginning."

The real estate association, which sponsored the initiative placing Proposition 14 in the constitution, has taken no action over the prospective initiative repealing the Rumford Act.

However, a private promotion is under way to put the initiative on the ballot, and a corporation has been formed sponsoring the move.

It is expected that shortly after the first of the year, efforts along this line will be redoubled.

## Burglars Get \$3,000 In Tools

More than \$3,000 worth of mechanic's tools were stolen early Tuesday morning from Bud Van Ornum Union Station, 2976 Sepulveda Blvd.

Bud Van Ornum, owner, arrived at the station at about 6:30 a.m. to discover that a burglar or burglars had forced entrance by smashing a window on a roll-up door with a piece of lumber.

Van Ornum reported to police that looters stole two red metal tool boxes containing numerous mechanic's tools, an acetylene torch, a hose, and several gauges.

The burglary occurred between 11 p.m. Monday and 6:20 a.m. Tuesday. Police said that a patrolling officer had checked the station at 1:15 a.m. Tuesday and found everything in order.

No suspects have been arrested.

## Road Work Scheduled In Redondo

A \$69,810 allocation to Redondo Beach for the improvement of several streets has been announced by Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The Board of Supervisors approved the allocation yesterday. Work will be supervised by the city.

The following improvements are scheduled:

- Kingdale Avenue from the Edison Co. right-of-way to 182nd Street—Money will be used to acquire right-of-way as part of a lease-purchase agreement with South Bay Shopping Center.
- Beryl Street at 190th Street—The alignment of Beryl will be improved and the intersection signalized.
- Ripley Avenue, from Inglewood Avenue to Lillenthal Lane—Ripley will be widened with curbs, gutters and paving constructed to provide for one traffic lane in each direction, plus parking lanes.
- Camino Real, from Prospect Avenue to South Juanita Avenue—The south side of Camino Real will be widened, and curbs and gutters will be constructed.
- Grade crossing at 182nd Street and railroad tracks—The crossing safety system will be improved.

"This type of cooperation between the County and its cities makes possible the development of highway projects which add to the continuity and efficiency of our countywide highway system," Chace said.
