The available positions are in several areas of specialization, including special services, youth performing arts, senior citizens, teenage programs, community center coordinator, and youth sports.

## Contract Awarded For Wells

The Tereon Co. of Pasadena has been awarded a \$151,942 contract by county supervisors for construction of another unit of the West Coast Sea Barrier Project.

Supervisor Burton W. Chase said the firm submitted a low bid for the project. The bid was \$62,354 less than the engineers' estimates.

Construction will get underway within three weeks and will take approximately six months.

It will involve drilling eight discharge wells in Manhattan Beach and El Segundo. The unit is part of the district's over-all effort to block sea water intrusion in a stretch of the county's west

coastline from Imperial Highway south to the Palos Verdes Hills.


