

Supervisor to Speak at Veterans Day Ceremonies

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn will deliver the principal address at the 32nd annual Veterans Day ceremonies Saturday at 10 a.m. at the Los Angeles Memorial Sports Arena. Chairman of Military and Veterans Affairs for the county, Hahn will speak on "Freedom Within and Freedom Without."

The public is invited to the traditional ceremony which pays tribute to the men and women who have served our nation in the armed services.

THIS YEAR'S program has been planned in cooperation with the Los Angeles Junior Chamber of Commerce Veterans Day Committee coordinated by Denny Glenn, Arthur W. Leslie Jr., and David Visel. Master of Ceremonies will be James D. Welch, past commander of the Los Angeles County Council, American Legion.

The Los Angeles Police Senior Band under the direction of Officer John Campbell will provide a band concert at 9:45 a.m. prior to the call to order.

THE TRADITIONAL wreath-laying ceremony in front of the Sports Arena will be at 11 a.m. by representatives of the Gold Star Mothers.

Congressional Medal of Honor holders, high-ranking military officers, and veterans' organization leaders will be special guests.

John J. Flynn, past commander of the Los Angeles County Council, Veterans of Foreign Wars, will lead massing of the colors and the Pledge of Allegiance will be given by Phillip Stone of the Jewish War Veterans.

The invocation will be given by Rev. Robert Habersham of Hamilton Methodist Church.

WELCOMING remarks will be made by Peter D. Houser, president of the Los Angeles Junior Chamber of Commerce, to be followed by a solo — "I Believe" — by Officer Gil Booth.

Lincoln's Gettysburg Address will be read by Col. J. L. Stromme, USAF (Ret.).

A rifle salute will be given by the U.S. Army Rifle Squad, and Taps will be played by Officer Robert Fritz.

The U. S. Armed Forces Color Guard will retire the Colors.

Drain Contract Awarded

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has announced award of a \$746,051 contract to R. P. Burruss of Montrose for construction of a North Torrance area storm drain and additional facilities in Hermosa Beach and Redondo Beach.

The construction consists of two short lines with one beginning in Firmona Avenue south in Firmona to 172nd Street. The other starts in 173rd Street, west of Condon Avenue, runs to Condon where it turns north to 172nd Street.

Construction will start within the next two or three weeks and take about nine months to finish.
