

Santa Ana, Temple City Rank First in CIF Polls

Santa Ana and Temple City continued their lead in the weekly CIF prep football polls.

The Saints, by virtue of their 33-0 drubbing of Marina, retained the "AAAA" top spot.

Temple City parlayed Morningside's 14-14 deadlock with Rolling Hills and a 39-7 thrashing of Bell Gardens to move ahead of the field on the "AAA" level.

Excelsior's Pilots get their sternest test of the season this week after inheriting the second spot on the "AAA" poll from Morningside. The Pilots clash with eighth-ranked Bellflower in a San Gabriel Valley League crucial.

Several key encounters are on tap for Southland prep this weekend as league races go down to the wire with two weeks remaining before the beginning of the play-offs.

While Santa Ana and Excelsior draw breathers, fourth-rated Burroughs will have its hands full with upset-minded Pasadena, currently eighth-ranked.

Servite, following a 0-0 tie with Mater Dei, clashes with Angelus League leader St. Paul in the other "AAAA" titanic.

In the "AAA" ranks, top-rated Temple City risks its league lead against South Pasadena in a Rio Hondo League decider. Bellflower and Excelsior round out the list of title-deciders on the next-to-last weekend of league action.

But survival gets tougher and tougher in the rugged Metro campaign. For instance, last week El Camino had to come from behind to defeat spirited East Los Angeles, 21-20, while Bakersfield was settling for a six-point win against Santa Monica, 19-13. In other games, Valley and Long Beach played to a 20-20 tie, and Cerritos edged Rio Hondo, 10-7.

Bakersfield's John Tarver broke loose on two touchdown runs to pace the Renegades against Santa Monica. Gene Martin of SMCC had a 58-yard TD gallop.

El Camino owes its perfect record to PAT specialist Charles Schindler, son of the former Trojan football great Amby Schindler. Against East L.A., with the score tied 20-20, Schindler kicked his 20th straight PAT to give the edge to the Warriors.
