Lik the players of USC and UCLA, Ram linebacker Maxie Baughan has Big Game fever. The collegians have their crosstown classic, but Maxie is all a-quiver as he awaits his own private cross-country caper at the Coliseum today with his onetime home team, the Philadelphia Eagles. "I've been waiting for this chance ever since I joined the Rams two years ago," he said this week at the Rams' practice field. "It means something special to me. I spent six years with the Eagles. I feel almost like I did at Georgia Tech before our annual Homecoming game. I don't suppose I will play any harder—I always play as hard as I can—but I sure want to make a good showing." State Wages Increase; Buying Power Declines

SACRAMENTO — Manufacturing production workers in California made more money than ever before during September, but their buying power was reduced by price increases during the year, the state department of industrial relations reported.

After allowance for state and federal taxes and the rise in consumer prices, the purchasing power of these earnings for the manufacturing production worker with three dependents was .6 per cent greater than in September of 1966. The consumer price index for California reflected increases in state taxes for the first time in September. Average hourly earnings in September were \$3.31, up 13 cents from 1966.

Entries Mount For Race

The field for the Rex Mays 300 has been increased by the filing of official entry forms by Bud Tinglestad of Dayton, Ohio. He will be at the wheel of a Federal Engineering Special for the 116-lap grid, first race for Indy cars in the Los Angeles area in 30 years.

Holiday Concert Planned

Two Torrance musical groups will display their talents Sunday, Dec. 10, at "Christmas, '67," a concert sponsored by the Torrance Recreation Department.

The wavy-haired bachelor is the ninth ranked driver in USAC national point standings with top finishes in 12 of 17 championship races run this season. His mount will be powered by a rear-engine Ford.

The public is invited to join the fun. There will be no admission charge. The concert will begin at 2 p.m. at the Torrance Recreation Center, 3341 Torrance Blvd.

Roger McCluskey of Tucson will be at the wheel of the G. C. Murphy Special, a rear-engine Ford-powered Eagle. This is the same machine McCluskey moved from 22nd starting position to third place in less than 20 laps at Indianapolis last May. Mechanical problems caused him to retire. He finished well up in other events this season, however, and currently is ranked ninth in USAC standings.

American Trot Set Next Week

Southland fans will witness harness racing at its best Saturday in the \$60,000 American Trotting Classic at 1 1/8 miles.

Dean Marvin Laser of California State College, Dominguez Hills, is co-author and editor of the new book, fourth and final volume in a series. Titled "Scope/Reading 4," the book is part of a series which the publishers have described as "the first ethnically and racially integrated high school anthology ever published."

Carlisle, a 4-year-old son of Hickory Pride, is the pre-race favorite to haul down first prize in the rich classic. The 65-day meeting comes to a close Nov. 20.

Dr. Laser has served as a dean of the School of Humanities and Fine Arts at Dominguez Hills since the spring of 1966. He formerly taught at California State College at Los Angeles. He holds degrees from the University of Chicago and Northwestern University.

Carlisle has already won the \$20,000 Beverly Hills Trot and the \$15,000 Long Beach Trot. Either Del Miller, whose wife Mary Lib is one of Carlisle's owners, the horse's regular pilot Billy Haughton, or Stanley Dancer will drive. The task will not be an easy one for Carlisle, with such top-ranking trotters as Sir Faffee, Real Speed, Lumber Son and Grandpa Jim figuring as the major contention in the Classic.
