Lomita Area Tops County Building Permit Report

Construction in the Lomita-Palos Verdes Peninsula area continued to lead Los Angeles County building activity during October, according to Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The County Engineer's Lomita-Palos Verdes District Office issued building permits valued at \$3,595,833. The total county figure for October was \$22,063,957.

The county figure reflected a general upward trend in 1967. It topped the October, 1966, figure of 21 million.

The Lomita-Palos Verdes District is the leading area in terms of building activity for the year. In October alone, 419 permits for new homes, businesses, and home additions were issued.

"The construction picture for this year is heartening after a dropoff in 1966," Chace said. "It is encouraging to note that much of the

California Highway Patrol Captain P. J. Ford said today that young men who are interested in becoming traffic officers should mark Dec. 16 in their calendars as a special day.

"This is the day the final examination for state traffic officer will be held this year," he declared. "Those wishing to take this test must have their applications on file by Nov. 22."

"We are seeking men between the ages of 21 and 31 who are interested in what we believe is a career with a purpose. Any of our officers will be glad to talk with such fellows about the job of highway patrolman, and we invite them to come into our office any time during the hours we are open. We also have information about the examination, including application forms, for their convenience."

IN ADDITION to the age factor, applicants must be in good health, have a high school diploma or its equivalent, be at least 5-feet-9, but not more than 6-feet-6, and meet other requirements.

Traffic officers' pay starts at \$676 a month, and increases in three annual steps to Personnel Board office.

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
