

Night Classes Slated By Business Division

Twenty-five business supervision, organization and management, personnel management, office management, and oral communications. Retail merchandising and principles of marketing are two merchandising courses scheduled.

Accounting courses offered include introductory accounting 1 and 2, intermediate accounting, tax accounting 2, bookkeeping, and accounting 1 and 2.

Secretarial job preparation classes include typewriting, typewriting review, shorthand, and office machines.

REAL ESTATE courses leading to the Real Estate Certificate issued with approval of the California Division of Real Estate and the California Real Estate Association are principles of real estate, real estate practice, real estate finance, and real estate appraisal 2.


The overall United Crusade goal for the Southwest area—including residential, commercial, industrial and public offices—is \$348,600, Leggett said.
