New Safety Lighting Approved

Acting on a request from residents in the area of Carson Street and Martin Street, the Board of Supervisors has approved the installation of a street light at that busy intersection, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said today.

The request for "better safety lighting" at the Carson crossing was implemented by an appeal from Sak Yamamoto, president of the Carson Chamber of Commerce, and members of that civic organization.

Chace pointed out that the proposed installation will provide illumination at this high-way intersection where there is presently no artificial light. The southern California Edison Co. will install the new light without charge, he added.

The intersection is used by countless school children. "Intersection Ahead" signs will also be erected on Carson Street in advance of Martin Street. The present school crossing signs will be relocated to effectively designate the existing crosswalk to motorists, Chace said.





