Cancer Control Clinic Opens

Los Angeles County Harbor General Hospital's "PAP" Clinic was officially opened Thursday, Nov. 16.

In commenting upon the opening of the Clinic, objective of which is to detect early evidence of cancer of the cervix which attacks 40,000 women in the United States annually, Leslie R. Smith, Administrator said: "It is hoped that the women in the communities Harbor General Hospital serves, will take advantage of this clinic, the objective of which is to aid potential victims of cancer of the cervix by alerting them to their danger and to furnish diagnostic evidence of that danger to their own private physicians for further treatment."

"Establishment of this Clinic at Harbor General Hospital is another indication of the widening role this hospital plays in serving its surrounding communities," Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, in whose Second District the medical facility is located at 1000 West Carson Street, Torrance, said Thursday. "This Clinic, which is supported by the Cancer Program of the U. S. Public Health Service, will serve as a community effort to control cancer. Harbor General Hospital,

through this program and many others, contributes on a broad basis to the community's health."

Hahn complimented the Los Angeles County Branch of the American Cancer Society for its participation in this program. The Branch has organized a Corps of Volunteers on a county-wide basis which will contact women in the various county areas, outlining the objective of the Clinic and urging them to cooperate in the testing program.

Dr. Duane Townsend, Assistant Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology, UCLA School of Medicine and Head Physician in that same service at Harbor General Hospital, and who will direct the Clinic said: "Although the regular hours are from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Mondays through Fridays, community groups may make special appointments by calling the American Cancer Society, Los Angeles County Branch."

The Clinic occupies approximately 1800 square feet in remodeled Building B-6, one of the original barracks, and is approached through and then to the right of the Carson Street entrance.
