

Early Superintendent of U.S. Steel Facility Dies

Henry T. Lintott, former general superintendent of U. S. Steel's Torrance Works, died Nov. 21 in Santa Cruz, Calif., it was learned here this week.

Mr. Lintott was chief electrician at Torrance Works in 1928, and a year later was named assistant general superintendent. He was made general superintendent in 1939.

In December, 1940, Mr. Lintott left the Torrance area to become manager of industrial relations at San Francisco. He held this position until 1945, when he joined Judson Steel Co.

County Gets \$3.4 Million For Roads

SACRAMENTO — Los Angeles County's share of highway user fees distributed during September was \$3,399,729, State Controller Houston I. Flournoy reported today.

Flournoy reported a total of \$26,204,385 went to the state highway fund for expenditure on state highways; \$10,478,084 directly to the counties; \$6,705,974 to the state highway fund for cities.

The total was derived from the following sources: gasoline tax, \$45,136,363; diesel fuel tax, \$1,533,293; by transfer from the motor vehicle transportation tax fund, \$1,392,674; and the balance from miscellaneous sources.

Career Day Program Held for Teenagers

Seventh and eighth graders from the Torrance Unified School District started going to college this week—if only to look around.
