Pueblo Fiesta Set Saturday

The annual Christmas Festival in the Pueblo Community has been scheduled for Saturday, according to Ruben Ordaz, president of the Pueblo Community Club which sponsors the event. Celebrated each year in observance of the birthday of the Virgin of Guadalupe, the festival will begin at 9 a.m. with an outdoor mass. The mass will be celebrated in the parking lot at St. Joseph's Mission, 2314 Del Amo Blvd.
