

Clyde Is Player Of Year

Dana Clyde, who quarterbacked the El Camino Warriors through an 8-1 football season, is "Player-of-the-Year" in the Metropolitan Conference.

In 1965 and Rick Eber received the same honor.

Clyde, an El Camino sophomore, who was a Redondo High graduate, connected on 129 of 241 passes to total 1,920 yards, 15 touchdowns and 13 interceptions. He averaged 14.89 yards per pass completion and maintained a 53.5 completion percentage.

Last season Clyde played behind quarterback Bob Quarry, and saw a limited amount of action. Nonetheless, he connected on 25 of 75 for 477 yards.

Clyde was the only El Camino football player to make the All-Metro Conference first team at quarterback.

Four of Clyde's teammates placed on the conference's second team. Center Henry Cooper and running back Tom Reynolds were named to the offensive squad, while linebacker Bruce Winnie and halfback Ed Eno earned positions on the defensive team.

Cooper, a 6'1", 205-pounder, from Hawthorne High helped hold the line both offensively and defensively. Last season he received an honorable mention.

Reynolds, a triple threat, led the Warrior offensive attack in scoring with 96 points. Reynolds, a 6'2", 190-pound fullback, scored eight touchdowns rushing, seven pass-receiving and a 91-yard kickoff return against Long Beach City College. The Morningside High graduate carried 125 times for 504 yards and hauled in 32 passes for 533 yards.

Winnie, a sophomore, served as an offensive guard and a defensive linebacker. Winnie, a 5'10", 200-pounder, is a graduate of Redondo High.

Ed Eno, another graduate of Redondo High, was credited with five of 16 pass interceptions.

As a team, the Warriors finished with an overall 8-1 record and a 6-1 conference mark, losing only to Bakersfield. This year's record accounts for the best showing since 1954, when the Warriors finished with a 7-0 conference and 9-0 season mark, losing only to Hinds, Miss., in the Junior Rose Bowl.

The Warriors outscored this year's opponents by 94 points, outrushing them 1,456 yards to 1,378 and outpassing them 1,983 to 1,326.

El Camino defeated L. A. Pierce, 35-7; L. A. City, 53-19; Long Beach City College, 49-41; L. A. Valley, 14-6; Santa Monica City College, 28-25; Cerritos, 28-7; East L. A., 21-20; and Rio Hondo, 31-14. The Warriors only loss came at the hands of Bakersfield. The Renegades handed the Warriors a 34-8 loss to take the Metro Conference title and a berth in the state junior college playoffs.

Ten Swift 2-Year-Olds Clash in Alamitos Race

Ten swift 2-year-olds clash for the biggest prize of the Los Alamitos fall quarter horse racing season Saturday when the Orange County track stages the \$135,300 Los Alamitos Futurity.

The 10 youngsters going in the Futurity were selected after last Saturday's Trials, the 10 fastest qualified for the Futurity.

Pre-race favorite is Laico Bird, the richest quarter horse in history. In 15 starts this year, the daughter of Good Bird has earned \$343,863. Most of that amount — \$228,300 — was accumulated in winning the \$486,600 All-American Futurity at Ruidoso Downs Labor Day. The race was the richest race of any breed in horse racing history.

Another contender in the Futurity is Top Rockette, winner of eight races in 13 outings. Her most noted effort was a 17.8 clocking to establish a track record at Bay Meadows last spring.

Two \$8,000 features are also carded for Saturday — the Moon Deck for 2-year-olds and the Josie Bar for older

horses. Both events are slated for 400 yards.
