Sanity Tests Ordered in Assault, Burglary Case

Court proceedings against a 19-year-old Torrance youth accused of assault with intent to commit rape have been delayed pending psychiatric examination.

Bobby Frederickson, 19, of 703 Sartori Ave., was arraigned on the charge in the Southwest Superior Court Monday. He also is charged with one count of burglary.

Judge Bernard Lawler, appointed a public defender for Frederickson and then ordered a psychiatric examination to determine the youth's present sanity and his mental condition at the time the alleged crime was committed.

The case was continued until May 15, at which time Frederickson is expected to enter a plea to the charges. Frederickson was arrested last March 17 after he was

shot once by an off-duty Torrance police officer who had heard a neighbor scream for help.

Police said Frederickson failed to heed a warning and was shot while fleeing from an apartment at 718 Amapola St.

Marijuana Charges Dropped

A 29-year-old Torrance man arrested last Tuesday on suspicion of possession of marijuana has been released from custody.

Charges against Carl Dean Norris, of 3713 W. 182nd St., have been dropped, police said.

In a memo to members of the TEA Representative Council, Marble urged teachers to write to Hanson and express their feelings on the proposal.

Marble said such a salary policy "could have a devastating effect on the educational program" in the Torrance schools.

Hanson's letter first appeared on the agenda for the April 17 meeting of the board, but trustees postponed any consideration of the proposal at that time. The board is expected to consider teachers' salaries tomorrow.


