

550 Flags To Honor Our Dead

Five hundred fifty American flags, honoring the dead of our wars, will fly Tuesday at Green Hills, 27501 S Western Ave., where Memorial Day services will begin at 10 a.m., according to B. T. Kenney, general manager.

The Fort MacArthur Band, under the direction of bandmaster CWO William A. Thompson will play for the services.

Clergymen of the Catholic, Protestant, and Jewish faiths will conduct brief services at the Park, then will board a U.S. Coast Guard helicopter for a flight over the Catalina Channel to drop wreaths in honor of those men lost at sea.

Members of the Associated Patriotic Societies of San Pedro, sponsors of the event, will also place floral wreaths at historic and official locations throughout the city.

In other colorful commemorative services, Buddhist followers will set up flower decorated shrines at two locations within the park. The Buddhist ceremonies will also be at 10 a.m.

NOTING the council has discussed the golf course plan many times, David K. Lyman said the city had repeatedly come to the conclusion that "we couldn't afford it. We're kidding ourselves."

Mayor Albert Icen said he favored using the land—located south of 235th Street and west of Crenshaw Boulevard—as a golf course, but wanted it developed by private enterprise. He said the city should abandon "pie-in-the-sky projects and get down to work."

ON MOTION of Olson, councilmen ordered Ferraro to continue his study of the lease proposal, but denied his request to hire an appraiser. Ferraro said a formal report will be made June 6. He made it clear that the report would not recommend acceptance of the lease as offered by Butcher.
