Guy R. Old Jr., journalism teacher at North High School, will serve as president of the South Bay-Centinel Journalism Education for the 1967-68 school year, according to Mrs. Helen Sisabaugh, retiring president. Miss Sisabaugh teaches journalism at Redondo Union High School.

A third generation newspaperman, Old received a degree in journalism from the University of Oklahoma in 1949 and a masters degree from the University of Colorado in 1956. He has taught at North High since 1956. Both his father and grandfather were newspaper editors in Oklahoma.

In 1962, Old received a Newspaper Fund fellowship for graduate study at Indiana University.




