

Saint John's Awards 168 Diplomas

Of those receiving diplomas, 136 were graduated from the college department surpassing the previous record of 132 in 1952.

Professional landscape entries will include local nurseries, the Southern California Landscape Contractors' Association, garden suppliers, garden clubs and societies.

There is no charge for the show and the public is invited.
