

Headlights Most Often Defective

Headlights are the source of the most common defect found by the five-man passenger vehicle inspection teams of the California Highway Patrol, Capt. Pat Ford, commander of the South Los Angeles area, said today.

"Slightly more than 90 percent of all cars inspected by the teams have something wrong with the headlights and it is usually improper aiming," Captain Ford said. "You can improve your chances of passing the inspection and receiving the CHP sticker if you have your lights adjusted now."

Headlights which are aimed too high can blind an approaching driver and headlights which are aimed too low reduce the field of vision of the driver of the vehicle. The latter defect is found most frequently, he said.

"The patrol has contacted auto dealers and manufacturers and has asked them to increase their efforts to see that the lights of the cars they sell are properly adjusted, but the driver is still responsible for knowing his car meets the law's requirements," Captain Ford said.

ECC Student Will Study At Vienna

Plans for the improvement of Torrance Boulevard between Normandie Avenue and the Harbor Freeway have been finalized and bids on the project will be opened July 11, according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Improvements will include widening the boulevard to four lanes, construction of curbs and sidewalks, and upgrading traffic signals. Slated for completion in October, Torrance Boulevard will be able to handle 26,000 vehicles per day, according to Hahn.
