

# Bays Invade Coliseum

The Baltimore Bays, one of the strongest teams in the National Professional Soccer League, make their only Southern California appearance of the year tonight when they play the Los Angeles Toros in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.

The match starts at 8, with a 6:15 preliminary scheduled between Los Angeles Valley College and Glendale College.

Baltimore, final team to join the 10-member NPSL in this opening season, is making a determined bid to become the league's first champion.

At this point the Eastern

Division title is a tossup among the Bays, Pittsburgh and Atlanta.

The Bays are a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Baltimore Baseball Club, and as of late they are playing with the same spirit shown by last year's world-champion Orioles.

A pair of twins from Jamaica, two former Israeli stars, and a famous halfback from the great Real Madrid team, have been spearheading the Bays.

Art and Asher Welch, 22-year-old Jamaican World Cup performers, have been alter-

nating in the forward line, and both have been terrific.

David Primo and Shimon Cohen are the Israeli players who have taken their toll of the opponents. Both are close friends of the Toros' Zehv Zeltzer, and they played a large part in influencing Zeltzer to come to the United States instead of accepting a large contract from South Africa.

Juan Santisteban is the Baltimore captain. Before he joined Venezia of Italy, he was an eight-year stalwart for Real Madrid. The trade to Italy amounted to \$200,000.

## Pomona Increases Purses

Purses for the horse racing program at the Los Angeles County Fair meeting this fall will hit the \$575,700 plateau, second richest in the 30-year history of racing here, Phil D. Shepherd, the fair's secretary-manager, announced this week.


The 14-day season gets under way Sept. 15 and extends through Sept. 30 with 12-race cards on tap daily throughout the Fair with the exception of Sundays.

Included in the purse schedule are 10 added money events, capped by the 20th running of the \$20,000 added Pomona Handicap at a mile and one furlong, to be decided closing day. Last year's renewal of the Pomona was annexed by Fleet Treat, She is expected to defend her laurels.

One slight change has been made in the stakes format, the C. B. Afflerbach Memorial Handicap, mile-and-one-sixth middle Saturday feature having been increased in value to \$15,000 in added money. This race traditionally points up the favorite for the Pomona a week later. All other stakes for thoroughbreds call for \$10,000 in added money.

The quick quarter horses will have their innings during the Fair, racing for an estimated gross purse of \$35,000 in the 17th running of the Pacific Coast Quarter Horse Racing Association Futurity, a 350-yard dash for 2-year-olds.

Twelve races will go to make up the daily cards, with the first two races for harness horses, the next two for quarter horses, followed by eight for thoroughbreds.
