

Torrance Poodle Judged Best in Top Competition

Shaggy dog stories are definitely on the decline in popularity, but this one has been gaining success at every telling.

It concerns a shaggy dog's shaggy dog — this one a champion — named Nagy Pegasus de Bo-Mi. This standard poodle has been anything but standard in the shows he's competed in, winning titles of American Champion, Mexican Champion, and needing only one more competition point to gain a Canadian Champion rating.

He was sired by International Champion Puttenove Promise of Boston. His mother was Champion Nagy Angeli Zephyr.

PEGASUS' most recent victory came in the Special Class at the Beverly Hills Kennel Club Show, in which he won out over such entries as a \$45,000 poodle owned by radio and television announcer Don Wilson. The show was judged by Herb Stoeker.

Next on the tour is the Orange Empire Kennel Club Show in San Bernardino. The local handler is Mitch Wooten; his first handler was Bob Forsythe of New York. In New York's Madison Square Garden, Pegasus won the "Best of Winners" title in 1966.

Thieves Make Off With Four Spanking New Autos

Four new 1967 Dodges were reported stolen from a stock yard during the past week from Del Amo Dodge, 20433 Hawthorne Blvd., after an inventory check by Manager Harry Allen discovered the vehicles missing.

The new cars, including three Dodge Darts and one Dodge Comet, were taken from the service yard during the past week without license plates. Exact time of the robbery is unknown, police said.

Allen said he received an anonymous phone call about one of the autos but failed to locate the stolen Dodge. He also said another person attempted to steal another car a couple of weeks ago, but failed when he attempted to drive the car through a chain fence.

That auto was found hung up on the fence, with its motor running, by authorities.

In an attempt to curb the theft, Allen said he is now using police dogs in the compound who have been trained in guard duty.

Although the four cars were taken without notice, Allen said he is confident that he will get them back.

Inoculations Scheduled

Local dog owners in the area will be given the opportunity to have their pets vaccinated against rabies on a cost basis July 11 and Aug. 3, County Poundmaster Marlin F. Thronson announced.

Rabies inoculations, which are required by state, county and city laws, will be given in the specified locations between the hours of 7 and 8:30 p.m. Cost of the injection is \$1.50 per dog.

Thronson explained that this is an epidemic area for rabies and due to the ever-present danger it is especially important that all dog owners protect their pets by having them inoculated against rabies.

Local inoculation locations will be at 3011 Palos Verdes Drive North, Rolling Hills, July 11, and Aug. 3 at the Alpha Beta parking lot, 616 E. 190th St., Gardena.
