

Anti-Smut Bill Clears Assembly

SACRAMENTO—The State Assembly has voted 75-0 for a bill which would set up a special standard of indecent material and prohibit its sale or distribution to persons under 18 years old.

The lower house cast the overwhelming vote for AB-1664 by Assemblyman John T. Knox, D-Richmond, even though a number of Republicans said they would have favored stronger legislation dealing with pornography in general and not just for minors.

Earlier this year, the senate had approved two bills, AB78179 by Senator Robert J. Lagomarsino, R-Ojai, tightening pornography laws. They had the support of Gov. Ronald Reagan, Lt. Gov. Robert H. Finch, Atty. Gen. Thomas C. Lynch, and many others. But the assembly committee on criminal procedure killed the bills on a party-line vote, with the Democrats voting against them.

KNOX, a member of that committee who voted to kill the Lagomarsino bills, then amended 1664 to provide one step toward control of pornography. Knox said he felt the bill was about as far as the legislature could go without running into constitutional questions.

Under the bill, material not be considered obscene but it could be considered indecent and its distribution to minors would be prohibited. As far as pornography in general, Knox's bill does not touch the clause in the present law which has been the main stumbling block in prosecutions.

This is the clause in the definition of obscene material which said it is "matter which is utterly without redeeming social importance."

Photo Day Scheduled In Gardena

Checks for Vets Due Earlier

Checks for more than 200,000 veterans who will attend college next fall under the new G. I. Bill for Vietnam veterans will arrive about 10 days earlier each month because of an improved system adopted by the Veterans Administration, according to Mort Webster, manager of VA's Southern California regional office.


Under the old system, veterans in school had to report to the Veterans Administration each month, and a card for this purpose was enclosed with each check. The need to process the cards before the checks to arrive about the 20th of the month.

A 10-day speed-up will result from dropping the requirement for monthly certification. Now a veteran who is attending an approved course at a college or university will certify his attendance at the beginning of the school year. Checks continue as long as he continues in school and has eligibility.
