In choosing your puppy, the choice is staggering. There are big dogs and little dogs; hairy dogs and hairless dogs. There are 115 distinct breeds of dog recognized by the American Kennel Club and over 26 additional varieties, purebred, but not AKC registerable.

And then, of course, countless mixed breeds can be

found just for the looking. Keep the city pounds in mind for this purpose. There are too many darling little canine hearts at the pound anticipating your footsteps. "Perhaps this is my human coming to adopt me," they say one to another.

No one breed of dog or mixture is the smartest, cleanest, most affectionate or best

with children in spite of all you might have heard to the contrary. Good breeding plus the proper care and training have developed these very desirable qualities in dogs of every kind.

Dog authorities agree that the best approach to choosing a dog is not a matter of which is the most ideal type but which dog suits you, your home and the life you lead.

WE CAN start your puppy buying with these few thoughtful facts and questions. Can you house a large dog or would one of the medium or small models fit better? How much time can you devote to grooming and exer-

traits and the physical characteristics of the different dogs. Attend an all breed dog show. Ask questions of qualified dog owners and breeders.

When you have finally narrowed down your preferences to a breed or two, you are all set to start looking for puppies. Be prepared for the fact that all puppies are cute. Don't fall for the first bundle of fur who saunters up and plants a moist kiss on your hand. Remember, you want the best pup for your family: a dog that is sound in both body and spirit. A healthy specimen has bright, clear eyes. His teeth sparkle, his gums are pink. His coat should be even and his skin clear and clean. Upon picking him up, his body should feel well rounded and firm. Observe his walk. His legs should be straight and sturdy.

Lastly, let a veterinarian check him over before you take final possession.

EVER HEAR of a boozehound? Of course, I'm only kidding but the State Liquor Control in Jacksonville, Fla., is trying to train "Hoss," a year-old German Shepherd dog, to be a boozehound. If the Shep makes it he will be used to lead investigators to moonshine whiskey stills in the Florida backwoods. BREED OF THE WEEK—Skye Terrier... The Skye Terrier, another member of the numerous family of Terriers, natives of Scotland, takes his name from the Isle of Skye, also the home of the Cairn Terrier. There is reason to believe that the Skye has looked much as he does today for at least four centuries. The first book entirely devoted to the dog, and entitled "English Dogs" by John Caius, penned about 1570, describes Terriers coming from "the uttermost countries northward which, by reason of length of hair, make show of neither face or body."

The Skye still makes no show of face or body by reason of their beautiful flowing coats, and the most frequently asked question about the breed is, "How does he see?" His long hanging bangs do not seem to interfere with the Skye's vision in the least, for his sight and hearing is extraordinarily acute.

Several of the other Terriers outnumber the Skye in registrations and popularity as of today, but no Terrier has been in general favor as long as the Skye Terrier.

He has been the fashionable and favored pet of English nobility for more than a century. He is still a great favorite in Scotland and England today.

The Skye's ornamental appearance does not mean he has forgotten his heritage as a hearty dog, vermin-killing terrier. Given the opportunity, he is still an alert, acrobatic, game-to-the-death terrier.

The Skye Terrier tips the scales at about 25 pounds and in height 9 inches.
