

Boys Town Barbecue Scheduled

Some 40,000 persons are expected to attend the Knights of Columbus Barbecue-Fiesta Sunday, April 28, at Rancho San Antonio, Boys Town of the West, 21000 Plummer St., Chatsworth, it was reported by John P. Gerhard, general chairman.

Highlight will be the old-time pit barbecue beef dinner served from 11:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. in a pleasant, grove-like area at the popular prices of \$2 for adults, 75 cents for children.

Billed as "the world's largest barbecue," the event will be open to the public, and Emile Jacobs, barbecue chairman, will be prepared to serve more than 15,000 diners, Gerhard said.

THERE'LL be a midway with carnival atmosphere, thrill rides for teenagers, kiddie rides, and old-fashioned beer garden with music and entertainment by Henry Zirkeland and his Bavarian Band, 35 colorful merchandise and game booths and the Fiesta Queen and her attractive court.


Tours of Rancho San Antonio will be conducted during the afternoon. Admission and parking free, corner of DeSoto and Plummer Streets.
