

Senate Group Blocks Open Meeting Proposal

SACRAMENTO—The senate committee on Governmental Efficiency has taken under consideration a bill which would extend the Brown Act requiring open meetings of public agencies to subcommittees of boards of supervisors or city councils, with little indication the bill ever would see the light of day again.

Senator Milton Marks (R-San Francisco), author of SB716, ran into heavy questioning from committee members who charged the bill would make it impossible for members of a local governing body

to have lunch together or play in a poker game, for fear they might discuss official business without having given notice and making the meeting a public one.

Michael Dorais, representing the California Newspaper Publishers Association, said the law never was intended to prevent members of boards or councils from attending social events together. Dorais

said the legislative council already had ruled that subcommittee meetings should come under the Brown Act and Marks' bill merely would restate this in the law, to serve as a guide for the legal counsel of local government.

"I don't care if one person or 10,000 come to a meeting," Marks said. "The question is that they have the right to be there."

Richard Carpenter, executive secretary of the League of California Cities, which traditionally has opposed the open meetings legislation, said California already has the toughest law against closed meetings in the nation.

The action of the senate committee in taking SB716 under submission was not too definitive, in that the bill

probably could be revived at a later date. However, in view of the strong opposition to the measure expressed by members during the debate, it was doubtful if the bill ever would win approval.
