

# Garden Checklist

1. The secret to long bloom with most plants is to keep faded blooms picked off. Letting them go to seed saps energy from the plant.
2. Keep pinching Fuchsias to encourage new growth. Feed them each month with liquid fish or other food which your nurseryman can recommend.
3. With the promise of hotter weather, apply mulches throughout garden area. A layer of two to three inches of peat moss, bark, or specially-prepared mulching spreads will conserve moisture and pay off in more luxuriant plant production. It keeps out weeds, too.
4. Ruffled growth and buds that "blast" and never open properly are usually a sign of thrips in Roses.
5. Keep a sharp eye to watering hanging baskets. With nothing, but the container, between the roots and the drying effect of air and sun, these generally require more frequent waterings than the rest of the garden.
