

Strict Gun-Control Bill Proposed Again

SACRAMENTO — Another attempt to obtain a tougher gun law for California will be made by Assemblyman Winfield A. Shoemaker, D-Santa Barbara, who said he wants his measure to be "the best, the toughest, and the most polished bill we could produce."

Shoemaker's effort follows the failure of a gun bill by Assemblyman Robert Crown, D-Alameda, which failed to get out of the assembly criminal procedure committee last week.

"THE SOONER a tough gun-control bill is passed," Shoemaker said, "the sooner our society will be confronted by fewer men with guns. The more difficult we make it for a man to obtain a gun for illegal use, the fewer weapons will be available."

The Santa Barbara assemblyman announced specifics to be contained in his measure. It requires:

All guns in California to be registered on an annual basis, and no one may buy a gun without a license. Program to be financed from licensing fees and a tax on ammunition.

Transfer of firearms ownership to be reported in the same manner as reporting the transfer of automobile ownership.

New purchases from dealers to require a 15-day waiting period, while department of justice determines whether it could be purchased legally.

In a private transaction between two individuals, when the seller knows the buyer and the buyer has a license, a transaction could take place immediately.

Inclusion of a civil liability section in the bill, with owner of a firearm who lends it to another, liable in tort and damages inflicted.

REGISTRATION would be a rebuttable presumption of ownership, meaning that until registration transfer is completed, original registered owner is liable for treble damages.

Extension of class of people prohibited from owning handguns which now consists of drug addicts, ex-felons and minors under 18, to former mental patients, and those who have been convicted of misdemeanors involving force, violence or use of firearms.

Inclusion in proscribed groups to be only basis now and for three years by which someone could be prohibited from owning hand-gun. However, three years from receipt of original license, renewal must take place, at which time applicant must take and pass a course on firearms safety.

Neurotics Seek Aid In Self Help Group

For the severe neurotic, life is but a chain of fear, depression, irritation, loneliness, and hate. But many emotionally disturbed people now feel that they are getting the help they need: through Neurotics Anonymous, an organization similar in structure and purpose to Alcoholics Anonymous.

Meeting each Thursday at 7:30 p.m. in the El Retiro Park building, NA is open to all, free of charge. Those attending sit around a table and freely discuss their anxieties for two hours. There is no trained psychoanalyst present (NA members conduct the meetings themselves) and no member attempts to psychoanalyze another. Only first names are used.

NA even has its own definition of the word "neurotic." A neurotic is "any person whose emotions interfere with his functioning in any way and to any degree whatsoever as recognized by him."

Those joining NA are asked to follow suggested steps toward conquering their illness. First, they must admit they are powerless over their emotions. They are asked to believe that a higher power will help them on the road to recovery.

AN IMPORTANT step in the NA program is to make a "fearless moral inventory," admitting faults and wrongdoings. Members should make amends for their own injustice toward others, the NA pamphlet explains.
