The only new series in violence-conscious Hollywood that isn't worried about its heroes carrying guns is NBC's "Adam-12." Co-stars Martin Milner and Kent McCord will play uniformed officers of the Los Angeles Police Department who will cope with crime as well as the smorgasbord of other duties officers face every day as buffers between the public and the troublemakers.

"This series is different because it's the first dramatic show to deal with the problems of the policeman," Milner told me. When I started to challenge him, he interrupted:

"All of the others dealt with investigative detective and made their lives look glamorous when actually they have routine duties—99 per cent checking on hotels and in stake-outs that sometimes last for days on end. Spend a random day with a police detective and it will usually be a dull one."

"ADAM-12" was created and produced by Jack "Dragnet" Webb, one of the most famous police detectives in the business, so I guess Milner knows what he's talking about. (If you're thinking about "Car 54 Where Are You,"—Milner classifies that as a comedy. "Adam-12" is serious.) So is Milner, whose freckle-faced exterior covers a pleasantly testy personality.

The title is taken from the LAPD radio call for the Milner-McCord patrol car A-12. In radio talk "A" is "Adam," a two-man car in the 12th District (a fictitious one). This is the second series Milner has spent riding around in a car with another guy. The first was "Route-66" where he shared a con-

vertible with George Maharis on a four-year, cross-country jaunt. That's a long time to spend on location. Bachelor Maharis, footloose sort, liked it; Milner, who is married and has four children, didn't. They parted friends. Well, almost.

"We're not in very close touch," said Milner.

"THIS IS one show where the gun is justified and violence is necessary," said Milner—voicing a familiar phrase. (Every actor this season thinks HIS violence is necessary.)

"But in the first show, the only thing killed is a dog," he said earnestly. (Wait until he gets those letters from the pet fanciers...)

In answer to my question, Milner said: "The Los Angeles Police Commission voted to sanction 'Adam-12.' The only other one so honored was 'Dragnet.' We have a responsibility therefore to deal honestly with real stories—even ones involving police brutality and riot control, if they come up."

Marijuana Plant Found by Police

A potted marijuana plant, orange capsules resembling Seconal, and various samples of what appeared to be marijuana were among the items confiscated by police Sunday night, when a tip-off led them to a North Torrance home.

Arrested for cultivating marijuana and possession of dangerous drugs was Michael J. Dwyer, 18, of 2615 W. 181st St. Police said they found a 4-inch potted plant in Dwyer's bedroom.

When police arrived at the Dwyer home, they found what appeared to be a marijuana cigarette and a box of the green leafy substance outside in the trash can. A search of Dwyer's bedroom turned up the orange capsules, more cigarettes, and a plastic bag of what appeared to be marijuana.

While police were questioning several male juveniles inside the home, Dwyer arrived home. Police said a search of his car revealed cigarette papers and what appeared to be marijuana seeds.

The younger youths were taken into custody for lack of proper supervision.

Forged Checks Appear

Forged payroll checks drawn on a Tucson bank have been appearing in the Western Greyhound Lines area, it was reported here today.

Officers of Western Greyhound have released information that the company never issues checks on other than a Bank of America branch in San Francisco. Checks have been presented bearing the name Michael E. Harris as payee and signed by James E. Dunham.

The forgeries are official looking payroll checks, printed on grey IBM cards with the Greyhound insignia superimposed on them. Persons receiving suspicious Greyhound checks have been asked to detain the prospective payee if possible and notify police.
