Cyclists Must Now Pass Road Test For License

Motor Vehicles Director Verne Orr has stated that any person who renews his California Driver's license and intends to drive a two-wheel motorcycle on a public highway must bring a motorcycle to a DMV office and show that he can operate it.

Exempted are persons whose licenses are already endorsed for motorcycle driving.

Because there was no such thing as a motorcycle driver's license (known as a "class 4 license") until the California legislature changed the law last year, Orr said a great many of the state's 350,000 registered motorcycles are being driven by persons who got their licenses by showing proficiency behind the steering wheel of an automobile.

HOWEVER, during the next four years, as licenses come up for routine renewal, everyone who wants to operate a two-wheel motorcycle or motor-driven cycle must prove to a DMV examiner that he can do so safely. "If he has been handling a motorcycle for quite a while, this should be no problem," said Orr.

"An applicant's first class 4 license or class 4 endorsement on a regular license renewal must be earned by passing both a special written test concerning safe motorcycle use and a skill test on a motorcycle," Orr stated.

"ON SUBSEQUENT license renewals the motorcycle driver, like the car or truck driver, will be required to pass only the visual and written tests unless there is a special reason to give him a road test as well," Orr stated.

Anyone operating a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, or minibike on California's public roads must be licensed to do so.

THE NEW dining facility, located just north of Del Amo Center at 21210 Hawthorne Blvd., is the sixth to be opened in Southern California in the past nine months. There are plans for 11 more within the year.

Traditional south-of-the-border specialties such as tostados, enchiladas, burritos, chile relleno, tamales, tacos, and guacamole are features of the Amigos Family Restaurant.

For the non-aficionado, Amigos features popular American dishes including sirloin steak, hamburger, shrimp and a low-calorie plate. Take-home service is also provided.

THE NEW Amigos Restaurant will serve luncheons from 11 a.m. until 4 p.m.

Friday and Saturday have been set aside for the late diner at Amigos, remaining open until 11 p.m. on these days.

Sunday through Thursday, the closing hour is 10 p.m.
